## BURGLARY FROM MOTOR VEHICLE / CRIMINAL TRESPASS TO MOTOR VEHICLE ARRESTS

On Friday, July 27, 2018 around 1:30 AM, Glen Ellyn Police responded to the 1100 block of Londonberry Drive following the activation of a vehicle alarm. Two subjects were seen fleeing from the vehicle. Officers located the two subjects in the area. Following an investigation, both subjects were taken into custody.

The first arrestee was identified as 18 year old Jaris McCullum of Lombard. McCullum was charged with five counts of Burglary from Motor Vehicle. McCullum was in possession of a stun gun at the time of his arrest and was charged with a single count of Unlawful Use of a Weapon.

The second arrestee was a 15 year old male juvenile. He was charged with five counts of Criminal Trespass to Motor Vehicle and was cited under local ordinance for a curfew violation.

Detectives from the Lombard Police Department assisted with the investigation.

Residents are encouraged to remove valuables and lock their vehicles when not in use.

Members of the public are reminded that a criminal complaint contains only charges and is not proof of the defendant's guilt. A defendant is presumed innocent and is entitled to a fair trial during which it is the State's burden to prove his/her guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
