

## Thursday , March 19 Update:

- It is important to note that the Village continues to operate while being closed to the public. Village employees continue to provide services and communicate via phone and email with residents and businesses during normal business hours. Village business including transactions for vehicle stickers, utility bills, permits and other payments can be conducted online, over the phone or by mail. Residents are asked to visit our [website](#) or call (630) 469-5000 to conduct this business. Additionally, a drop box in the parking lot behind the Civic Center can be used for document and payment delivery. - The Glen Ellyn Police Department will not be enforcing overnight parking restrictions from 2-6 a.m. through the end of March. It is not necessary to call the Police Department regarding on-street overnight parking. Additionally, to assist residents and downtown businesses, the Police Department will not be enforcing downtown parking restrictions except hydrant, crosswalk and handicap parking.
- The Chamber of Commerce, the Alliance of Downtown Glen Ellyn and Village staff are collaboratively working together to support the Village's local businesses.
