Village Welcomes Continued Intergovernmental Cooperation with COD

Glen Ellyn, IL – The College of DuPage recently requested that the DuPage County Circuit Court clarify its opinion related to the College’s lawsuit filed against the Village of Glen Ellyn arguing it was immune from almost all Village ordinances. The Court previously ruled on the lawsuit, stating that the College is subject to the Village’s codes and ordinances (subject to a three-part test outlined by Judge Terence M. Sheen).

At a court hearing on Tuesday, December 6 Judge Sheen did not sustain the College’s motion to clarify his prior opinion. Judge Sheen indicated through this decision that he would like to review Village regulations under the three-part test explained in his prior opinion (see prior opinion [here](#)).

The Village welcomes the Judge’s review of its regulations under the three-part test. When the test was previously applied to the Village’s liquor license regulations, Judge Sheen found that the Village’s liquor ordinance did apply to COD.

Also in the spirit of intergovernmental cooperation encouraged by Judge Sheen, at the recent court hearing, the Village offered to the College possible terms for a 2012 Intergovernmental Agreement. The Village awaits the College’s response to those possible terms.
